Stroud Green Primary School is committed to supporting Fairtrade wherever possible. Fairtrade is about guaranteeing a better deal for producers in developing countries. We believe it is important for pupils to find out about issues beyond the classroom and help to make a positive contribution to the world in which they live. It is an opportunity to learn how individual consumer choices can make a real difference to people's lives.

At Stroud Green Primary we:

- have set up a Fairtrade steering group
- ensure that Fairtrade is part of the School curriculum map.
- use Fairtrade products wherever possible including;
 - Tea, coffee, sugar and biscuits during meetings including parents meetings.
 - In cooking activities.
- ensure Fairtrade products are available wherever possible, for example, at events in the school or the community.
- ensure that learning about Fairtrade takes place in each year group including assemblies.
- promote Fairtrade in the school and wider community, by taking part in Fairtrade Fortnight, highlighting Fairtrade activities in newsletters, and running a Fairtrade stall at school events.

All teaching and non-teaching staff at Stroud Green School are responsible for ensuring that all pupils, irrespective of gender, ability, ethnicity and social circumstances, have access to the curriculum and make the greatest possible progress. We will ensure that all pupils are involved in our efforts to support and promote the Fairtrade initiative.

In line with the standards for 'Fairtrade Schools,' Stroud Green School is committed to Fairtrade. This means that:

- We use Fairtrade produce as much and where possible.
- We teach and learn about global trade works and why Fairtrade is important.
- We take action for Fairtrade in the school and the wider community.

The Fairtrade Steering Group will be made up of members of the school community, including staff (Christine Ng and Evridiki Charalambous) and a governor, where possible.
