Dear Parents/Carers,

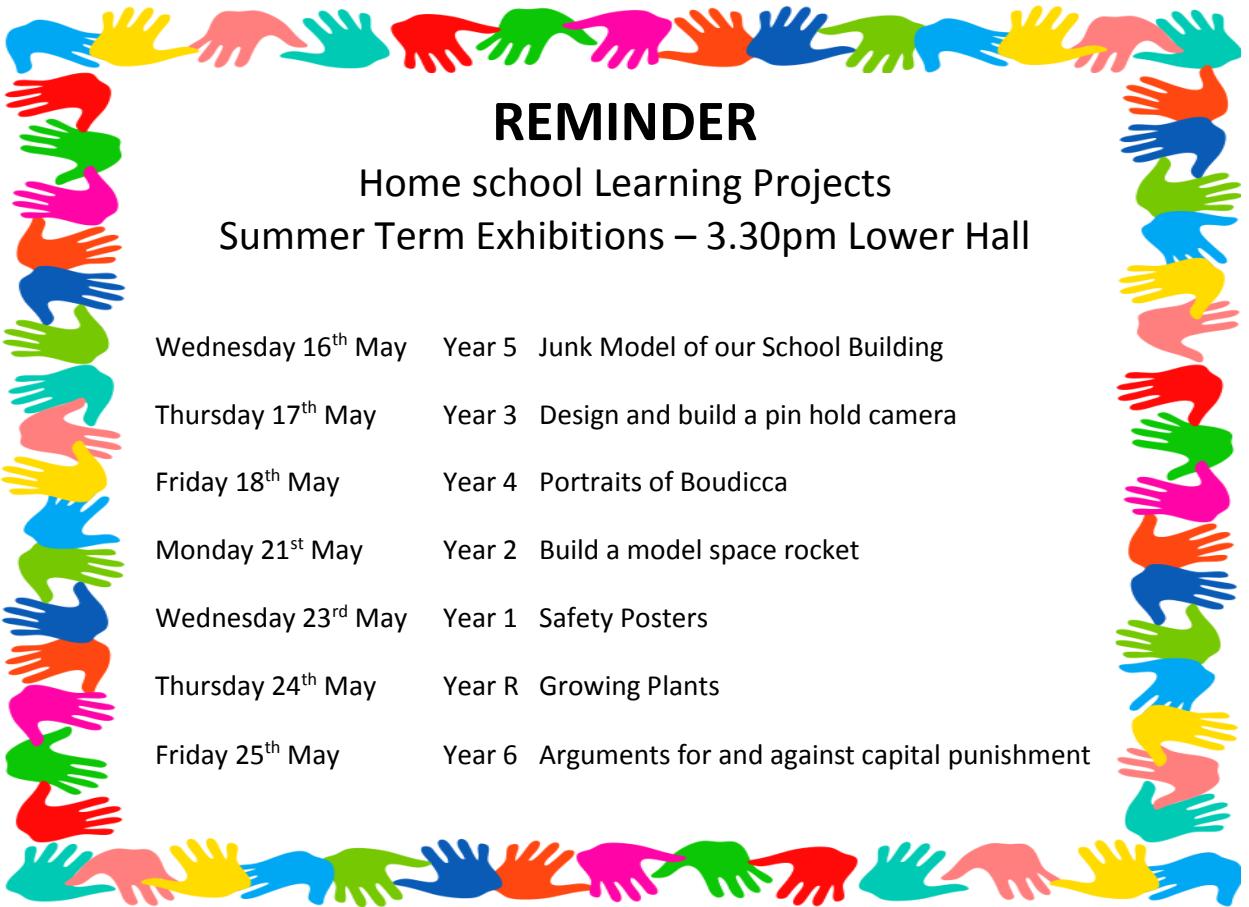

Flexi-Schooling

What is it?

"Flexi-schooling" or "flexible school attendance" is an arrangement between the parent and the school where the child is registered at school and attends the school only part of the time; the rest of the time the child is home educated. **At Stroud Green we are one of only a handful of local schools who offer this flexibility in their educational approach.**

How does it work?

You make an appointment to see Cal the Head Teacher who will talk you through the school policy of how it works – make an agreement to home educate your child one day a week (we offer Fridays only).



What does home education look like?

It looks like whatever you think your child needs.....it might be a visit to a museum, a walk on the heath a day in the kitchen baking a visit to the shops, family, farm, zoo..... it may be time visiting relatives or catching up with board games at home. It's about the social and emotional support of your child.

What do I do if I want to know more?

Email Ms Shaw at head@stroudgreenprimary.com or ask in the playground if there are any other parents already doing it – we already have 25 children who regularly flexi-school on Fridays.
